

**CROMARTIE HERITAGE SITE INVENTORY**  
**Inventory as of 2014 - by Tom Lennon**  
**Updated 30 September 2023 – by Sandra (Lennon) Ludden**

The following are sites we know that have some type of link to the Cromartie family, e.g., William of Orkney's descendants. (Note: NC # = North Carolina State Routes)

**Note:** \* = Sites recognized in state or national historic places register.  
# = GPS location done.

1. **\*South River Presbyterian Church (SRPC).** On the northeast side of SR 210, 1,7 miles southeast of the intersection of SR 210 and US 701. Address: 1899 SR 210 East, Garland, NC 28337. 34°43'48.0"N 78°24'02.0"W #
2. **\*Stuart Cemetery.** Almost directly behind SRPC on an unnamed dirt road. Go 0.2 miles northwest from the church. Turn right onto the dirt road. There are two mailboxes there: Numbers 1687 & 1669 (SR 210). Go 0.8 mile down that road, to where there is a faint turnout on the right. Park there and walk in, less than a hundred feet, and the cemetery is there, lined partially with a steel wire and short posts. #
3. **Alexander Cromartie's Home.** Currently known as "Cederville", located at Mailbox #1105 on SR 210 between the SRPC and the intersection of SR 210 and US 701. #.
4. **William Cromartie's Home stone marker.** Just north of the intersection of SR 210 and US 701, on the right at Mailbox 1576 on US 701 N. Road is gated with a cable. #
5. **William Cromartie Cemetery.** Our "William of Orkney" ancestor's grave. Cemetery is about a quarter mile down the gated road beside William's marker. See #4 above. #
6. **William King Cromartie house ruins on Peter Cromartie Road.** Near commercial turkey farm and near intersection of Peter Cromartie Road and Hell Town Road. Power line clearing crossing Peter Cromartie Road is the landmark. #
7. **William King Cromartie Cemetery.** Across the road from the house ruins and the power line clearing, is also the landmark for a faint sand road leading down to the cemetery. #
8. **\*Mt. Horeb Presbyterian Church and Cemetery.** Fifteen (15) miles east of Elizabethtown on State Hwy SR 87. It is at the intersection with the road to Lisbon, on the left when traveling north on SR 87, East of Elizabethtown and just before Carver. Built in 1845. 34° 30.969' N, 78° 27' W. #
9. **James William Cromartie House.** Also known as Jim Bill Cromartie – Dr. Cread's place. #
10. **James William Cromartie Cemetery.** Located on N side of US 701, between NC 210 and SR 1527. Can be seen from highway.

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11. **Rich Cromartie's Home.** (This was Jane & Layton Ross' Home in 2014) – 2425 Cromartie Rd, Elizabethtown, NC 28337. #
12. **Peter Cromartie's Stone and Cemetery.** On right of Peter Cromartie Road intersection with Hell Town Rd. #
13. **Brompton Home.** Original two sites of "Little Brompton" not located.
14. **"Little Brompton", Duncan Cromartie's Home.** (Owned by Lynn Gray King Jr. as of 2014) on Elizabethtown Bypass. #
15. **Cromartie Corner, historically known as Hickory Grove,** including #:
  16. Angus Cromartie's home on NE corner;
  17. Dr. Sam Cromartie home and office, just north of Angus Black's home;
  18. Cemetery between these last two houses;
  19. Doane Cromartie's home on SE corner;
  20. Ben Cromartie's (burned) house on SW corner.
21. **\*Brown Marsh Presbyterian Church.** Located at 8561 Mercer Mill Brown Marsh Rd, Clarkton, NC 28433. Southeast side of SR 1700, 0.1 miles south of junction with SR 1762, near Brown Marsh. Just E of the Robeson County line. Organized prior to 1755 by early Scottish settlers. Current building was built in 1818, and it is the oldest church in Bladen County.

22. **Clarkton Cemetery.** Located in Clarkton, Bladen County, NC. 34.49996, -78.65203 #
23. **\* Black River Chapel (Black River Presbyterian Church).** Located at SR 1102, 0.1 miles E of SR 1100, Ivanhoe, Sampson County, North Carolina. Located in Atkinson. #
24. **South River Church Landing.** #
25. **Cromartie Bridge.**
26. **\* Dr. David Dickson Sloan Farm.** Located on the E side of US 701, 0.7 miles N of South River, in the vicinity of Garland, North Carolina. #
27. **\* Dr. David Dickson Sloan Cemetery.**

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28. **Sloan Bridge.** “Garland” was once called “Sloan Crossing” for this bridge.
29. \* **Trinity Church and Cemetery.** #
30. **Hendon Cemetery.** Located in Elizabethtown, Bladen County, North Carolina.

31. **Duncan Cromartie’s Mill Site.** Located on 1885 map but not found.
32. **Two Other Mill Sites: William Cromartie’s Mill and Patrick Cromartie’s Mill.** Across the road from “Cederville”, Alexander Cromartie’s Home. Located on 1885 map but not found.
33. **Gun Factory.** Located on SR 41 near Tomahawk. State Historical Marker. #
34. **Moore’s Creek National Battlefield.** Located at 40 Patriots Hall Dr, Currie, NC 28435. #
